



SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

The purpose of this scholarship is to offer financial assistance to a qualified high school graduate, who will be entering, or are currently enrolled in, an institution of higher education. The applicant should have a sound academic record and be of good character. Leadership qualities, school activities, church and community involvement will be considered.

ELIGIBILITY

To receive this scholarship an applicant must (1) be a member, or the son or daughter of an active member, in good standing with the Knights of Columbus Council #2574, (2) be graduating from high school, (3) have applied for admission to a recognized institution of higher learning, (4) maintain a grade point average above the level that would result in scholastic probation.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

An applicant will be given consideration for a scholarship only when all the following have been received by the scholarship committee.

- 1) A complete General HS Scholarship application
- 2) Essay (see details below)
- 3) A high school transcript for all academic work, including class rank, grade point average, and college admission test scores
- 4) A college transcript – if applicable

REIMBURSEMENT

Recipients will be presented scholarship monies at a Knights of Columbus event held at the K of C Community Center. Invitations will be sent to recipients. Monies are presented in honor of deceased Knights.

DEADLINE

Upon completion of the application form, applicant will present it to appropriate high school counselor or principal prior at the designated school deadline.

ESSAY:

Knights of Columbus Council #2574 Scholarship funds are derived from their Annual Golf Tournament, drive-thru fundraisers, scholarship fund donations & the active participation of members & their families in the various Fraternal, Service & Insurance Programs. With this being the case, write a short essay indicating how you, your father/family have been involved in, benefitted and/or been impacted from the various K of C programs. Include officer/committee/chairman positions, work group #, Council fundraising & financial/insurance participation. In addition, identify who, when, where & why the Knights of Columbus was started, their mission & list the 3 qualifications for membership in the K of C's. K of C Membership # for self, or father must be included on essay paper in right hand corner.
